Spring is here!

A mild winter and early warm spell helped create many reports of a successful calving season, and that's good news! Grass is growing and, as usual, our Angus cows and calves are eager for green grass.

With spring breeding season just getting underway and forage production just around the corner, it seems premature to be thinking of fall and winter feed budgets.

However, if weather forecasts match predictions, 2016 could be a trying year across the Midwest. All indications are that El Niño will subside sometime in mid-2016, and give way to La Niña. Thus, it is expected that many parts of the Midwest will experience a wet spring, followed by a potentially significant drought later in the year. Projected drought stresses the importance of making plenty of good quality forage early in the growing season in potentially wetter than normal conditions and a drought management plan to avoid being caught off guard similar to 2012. Do you have your feed procurement plan in place?

On the topic of planning, many dates of fun and educational activities lie ahead this summer. Mark your calendar for these upcoming events and invite a customer or neighbor to join you.

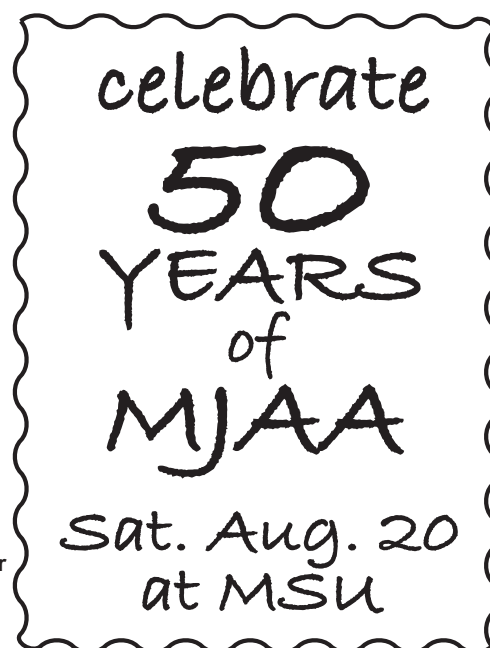

CLASSES FOR BOTH JUNIOR & OPEN CATTLE IN STATE PREVIEW SHOW

The Michigan Beef Showcase on June 10-12 at the MSU Pavilion in East Lansing is the site of the Michigan Angus Junior and Open Preview Show. Adult Angus breeders are encouraged to enter cattle in the Open Preview Show. Junior and open entries will show at the same time. Classes include heifers, cow-calf pairs, bulls and steers, as well as youth showmanship. A link to entry information is accessible at www.michiganangus.org; click on Coming Events.

Exhibitor's birthdate for the Jr. Angus Preview Show must be from January 1, 1995 through December 31, 2007. Exhibitors in the open show must have reached their 8th birthday by January 1, 2016.

Entries must be POSTMARKED by May 25, 2016. Late entries are accepted but at a significantly higher fee. Early bird cattle arrival is from 6 to 9 p.m. on Friday, June 10. However, cattle exhibitors may wait to arrive until Saturday. All cattle must be checked in between 10:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday, June 11. Showmanship for all youth exhibitors will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, followed by crossbred steer and market heifer classes. All breed shows are on Sunday, June 12 with Angus being the first breed to show, beginning at 9 a.m.

in remembrance of angus friends

Fellow cattle producers honor legacy of David McMahon Sr.

David McMahon Sr., Fort Smith, Ark., a lifelong Angus breeder, former AAA board director and supporter passed away March 23. David was the owner of Belle Point Ranch and Belle Point Beverages Inc., and served on the Association's Board of Directors, including the first Certified Angus Beef LLC board and as co-chair of the Angus Foundation Leadership Cabinet.

He was born March 26, 1931, in Clarksville, Ark., to Donald James and Marguerite Dixon Tyson McMahon. David is survived by his wife, Mary Ann; four daughters, Mary Lynn Holland and husband Marvin Holland, Jr., of Branch, Kathleen McGuire and husband Tim McGuire of Fort Smith, Julie French and husband Steve French of Beaverton, Mich., Susan Taylor and husband Rick Taylor of Lavaca; one son, David McMahon, Jr. and wife Tammy of Fort Smith; 11 grandchildren and one great-granddaughter; and brother Jim McMahon of Fort Gibson, Okla.

David was a man of vision and integrity. He celebrated imagination, and worked to develop his innovative ideas. He eagerly served God, his family and his fellow man. He was a connector of people, a collaborator in projects, and a collector of friends. He embraced giving as an opportunity.

In 1953, he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture, majoring in Animal Husbandry. While in college, David was a member of Kappa Sigma Fraternity and served in the Army ROTC program. He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army and earned the rank of Captain. His two years of active duty included one year in Korea. He served four years as an officer in the Army Reserve. In 1955, David rejoined his family's Anheuser-Busch distributorship. Upon his father's death in 1965, he assumed leadership of the company now known as Belle Point Beverages, Inc. He served on the first Anheuser-Busch Wholesaler Advisory Panel from 1968 to 1971. This panel established the Wholesaler Equity Agreement, a standard of business that is still honored today. This year marks 70 years of exclusive partnership with Anheuser-Busch, providing sales and service to retailers in Arkansas and Oklahoma.

David married Mary Ann Lovoi in 1953, having known her since kindergarten. They raised five children on their 40 acres in south Fort Smith, educating them at local private and public schools, in the 4-H and the Junior Angus programs. Although David grew up showing gaited horses, he discovered a passion for purebred cattle in his college years. In 1975 the McMahons established Belle Point Ranch in Lavaca as a second family business. The ranch quickly grew to national prominence in the Angus breed. His children, their spouses and his grandchildren are all involved in the annual Angus production sale each spring.

He was a devoted contributor and tireless worker for youth development. In addition to employing hundreds of high school students over the years at Belle Point Ranch, he was passionate about Immaculate Conception School, 4-H, Boy Scouts, Junior Livestock Auctions, the Boys Shelter and Girls Shelter, and state and national Junior Angus Associations. Because he believed that youth programs shape individuals into productive citizens and the leaders of tomorrow, he supported these programs, and many others, with his time, knowledge and checkbook.

The family has chosen six memorials from which to honor Dave's memory, including the Angus Youth Development Endowment Fund, 3201 Frederick Ave., Saint Joseph, Mo., 64506.

Agriculture loses livestock leader with big vision, Harlan D. Ritchie, Ph.D.

Harlan D. Ritchie, Ph.D., beloved husband, father, colleague and friend, passed away April 27. Harlan was born August 3, 1935 to Donald and Irma (Johanson) Ritchie in Storm Lake, Iowa and was a 1953 graduate of Albert City High School.

After graduating from Iowa State in Animal Husbandry, Dr. Ritchie began his Michigan State University career as an assistant instructor in 1957 and became a full professor of Animal Science in 1971.

Harlan's career at MSU spanned close to five decades. He was so very fortunate to have spent that time doing what he loved so much; working with people to improve their lives, and working with the Michigan, National and International beef industries to improve production, management and animal welfare. His memory is cherished by so many.

Over his career Harlan received a plethora of awards. Among his most prized were the MSU Distinguished Faculty Award, the ISU Animal Science Hall of Fame Award, and the Iowa State Henry A. Wallace Award.

After retiring in 2005, Harlan rediscovered his passion for recreational reading and focused on World War II and The Civil War. He delighted in discovering compadres who shared his interests and could discuss the complexities and minutia of both conflicts. Son, Don was one of his favorite discussion partners. Harlan loved winters in Belleair, Florida where he learned that walking the beach was a marvelous vocation. Summers in Elk Rapids, on Lake Michigan, provided similar opportunities and a deck that beckoned the reader and author that he was. He never lost his love for animals and the greatest dog ever, Hoover, was his constant companion.

In 1957 Harlan married Lou Ellyn Hale, who preceded him in death in February 1993. In 1996 Harlan married Leah Cox Hoopfer.
