Congratulations to Dave and Joan Lutchka, Grass Lake on winning the elaborate Priefert cattle working system offered at the AAA convention.

Although we have seen a downturn in prices for fed cattle, cull cattle, and feeder calves in recent months, the demand for quality still remains. The American Angus Association's acquisition of Verified Beef, including its proprietary Reputation Feeder Cattle® program, will add value to Angus-influenced commercial operations. Demand for Angus seedstock remains strong. In late October, in a joint effort with Michigan Simmental Association, our association held the annual female sale at UPI in St. Louis. As always it was a large crowd, and good cattle were in demand.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: All cattle must meet the Michigan Beef Expo health requirements before check-in time. All sale cattle must have negative test results for Bovine Viral Diarrhea (BVD) and all bulls must pass a Breeding Soundness Exam in order to sell. In addition, the MI Angus Association has adopted the MI Cattlemen's Association Vaccination Stamp Program for cattle that will participate in the Futurity. Please refer to the following for specific vaccination requirements: http://www.micattlemen.org/CMDDocs/MichiganCA/2014_Example_Vaccination_Sheet.pdf

PENNED FEMALES: An individual consignor to the Futurity may enter up to three (3) REGISTERED, non-HALTERED females that are born on or after January 1, 2016. These females will be penned in a designated area of the MSU Pavilion. Penned females **will not** be shown. Consignor must provide certificates of registration from AAA. *Please indicate on the entry form if your female entries will be haltered and shown OR penned and not shown.*

GENETIC TESTING: MAA requires sale consignments that are potential carriers any known lethal genetic defect for which there is a commercial test available, be tested. Test results MUST be available and provided when entries are submitted. Consignor is responsible for the cost of testing. If the animal is confirmed as a carrier, it will not be cataloged. If you are unsure of the status of your consignments, please call the American Angus Association at 816-385-5500. To discuss issues related to genetic testing procedures, please contact Casey Jentz, AAA Regional Manager at 608-234-1998.

DUES and ENTRY FEES: All consignors must be current members of the Michigan Angus Association. If not currently a paid member, please add \$25 for membership dues to your entry fee. ALL consignors to sales held in conjunction with the Michigan Beef Expo must also be members of the Michigan Cattlemen's Association. For more information regarding this policy, please contact MCA at 517-347-8117.

Entry fee of \$100 per lot is due by February 1, 2018. Entries received after 2/1/18 will be required to pay \$150 per head entry fee.

American Angus Association Announces Acquisition of Verified Beef

New feeder calf program will grow market share by increasing use of registered Angus bulls.

FORT WORTH, TEXAS (November 4, 2017) — American Angus Association announced today it has entered into an agreement to acquire the assets of Verified Beef, including its proprietary Reputation Feeder Cattle® program. The deal underscores the Association's commitment to programs that increase the use of registered Angus bulls in the commercial segment, growing value for the Angus breed and the entire membership.

Association CEO Allen Moczygembba says establishing a feeder calf program built on the use of registered Angus bulls that ties calves back to superior Angus genetics was a strategic priority set by the board in 2016.

"By marrying the advanced technology platform and proprietary software from Verified Beef with the strength and scale of the Angus brand, the Association will deliver a feeder calf program that is not only invaluable to commercial cattlemen but is unmatched in the industry," he says. Cattle feeders need metrics that align with the traits most valuable to their business, specifically gain and grade, Moczygembba explains. The Angus feeder calf program will provide a simple tool that validates the genetic potential of feeder calves.

The Association will build on the Reputation Feeder Cattle® program. While the current offering is based on a dollar scoring system, its underlying data analysis methodologies and computer modeling can be adapted to alternative scoring systems, such as the indexing system envisioned by American Angus Association.

"We're confident that as cattlemen better understand the overall performance of Angus genetics, they'll replace other breeds in their bull battery with Angus bulls," Moczygembba says.

According to Tim Watts, chief executive officer of Verified Beef, "Selling calves the old fashioned way, without genetic data, doesn't work."

"Top Angus calves are consistently undervalued by several dollars per cwt. or more," Watt says. "Calves from several other popular breeds are often significantly over valued, and the only way to fix this broken marketplace is for the AAA to implement an industry-changing feeder calf program."

The program, which will be configured and integrated with existing Angus systems, is expected to be available in summer 2018. An index scoring system will replace the estimated dollar values currently offered. Herds will receive three genetic indexes: average daily gain, quality grade and a score for replacement heifers.

Moczygembba says, "The index scores will help our ultimate customers, commercial cattle feeders and cattlemen, make informed decisions, even in the fast-paced sale barn."
